## **About the Vedanta Society**

Vedanta teaches that humanity's real nature is divine, that the true object of human life is to unfold and manifest this divinity, and that truth is universal. Vedanta accepts all the religions of the world and reveres the great prophets, teachers and sons of God, because it recognizes the same divine inspiration in all.

The Vedanta Society of Southern California was founded in 1930 and incorporated as a non-profit religious corporation in 1934. The Society maintains a temple, convent, and monastery in both Hollywood and Santa Barbara; a monastery and shrine each in San Diego and Trabuco Canyon; and the Vivekananda House in South Pasadena. There are a number of official Vedanta societies in the United States, Europe and South America. Although the societies are under the spiritual guidance of the Ramakrishna Order of India, each is an independent, self-supporting unit.

**Membership** is open to those who are seriously interested in the teachings of

Vedanta and have attended lectures and classes for some time. In addition, an interview with Swami Sarvadevananda is required. Applications are available in the Society office and/or bookshops.

**Private instruction** in spiritual practice is available by appointment from Swami Sarvadevananda to those who have attended classes and lectures for some time and want to deepen their spiritual life in the path of meditation. There is no charge for this instruction. Appointments may be made at the local centers

Information and a large selection of books on Vedanta and other religions are available at the Hollywood, Trabuco and Santa Barbara bookshops. Some books are also available at the San Diego Center. Check our website for current hours. Some of our centers maintain a lending library for the use of members.

# From the Complete Works of Swami Abhedananda

As the primordial Energy personified, Goddess Durga created all worldly things. The very power of Hers which has created animals has also grown and sustained vegetables and plants. Hence her name has been 'Śākambhari' (The 'herb-bearing' or the 'herb nourishing').

On the first day of Durga worship it is the custom to pay regard to an image of a goddess made of the leaves of nine plants

and supposed to represent Durga. The said image is called *Nava-patrikā* (commonly called *Kala-bau*), or the Goddess Durga in her nine forms. This *Nava-patrikā* consists of varied types of fruits, roots, corns and flowers ... which, when bound together, give rise to the image of *Nava-patrikā* which may be called a symbol of agricultural wealth.

On the bright fifth waxing in Māgha, Goddess Sarasvati is invoked by every Hindu. ... The word Sarasvati stands for 'a river with abundant current of water'. The Vedas say Sarasvati was the inspirer of all kinds of knowledge. Undoubtedly therefore, she was the goddess of learning even though she was a river. Sarasvati is regarded as the presiding goddess of all branches of knowledge, such as fine arts, mechanics and the art of music and dancing. Later when the image of Goddess Sarasvati was conceived, the symbols of the river, the water, the lotus, and the swan were retained, while, at the same time, in her hands were placed a book, a pen, and a Veena, and the complexion of her body was made gleaming white, suggestive of pure illuminating knowledge of wisdom. Being thus identified with the Goddess of Speech personifying the Śabda-brahman (the Logos, or the Word of God-incarnate), she began to be adored by men. Two things emanate from Her—one, suggestive of sound, the other suggestive of letter. That is why in the hands of Sarasvati are placed a Veena, symbolizing the first, and a book symbolizing the second (śabda and mātrikāvarna).
